



Levi D. McClenny of College Station was appointed to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board by Governor Greg Abbot in June 2020. He will serve as the Student Representative through May 31, 2021.

Mr. McClenny is a Ph.D. Candidate in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas. Additionally, he is an officer in the United States Army Reserves, currently serving in an Aviation Battalion in Conroe, Texas as a Blackhawk pilot. He is a Research Assistant in the Department of Electrical Engineering at Texas A&M and is currently collaborating with the Army Research Lab on research areas of interest to the Department of Defense. His research focuses on artificial intelligence methodologies with applications in material systems.

He was formerly a member of the Corps of Cadets, a member of B-Company, and was a founding member of C-Company.
